Meet **John Bbosa**, Left; a 20 year old blind boy who sat for his UACE examinations and passed well. He has hopes of being sponsored by the government at university.

Six year ago, John was a mere little boy who had completed his primary education from the School for the Blind in Jinja and had no hopes of further studies as his parents are poor and besides, he is blind.

In 2005, John sat for his Primary Leaving Examinations from the School for the Blind in Jinja which is supported by the Rotary Club of Jinja.

In 2006, through the Memorandum of Understanding with Rotary Club of Jinja, Tofta Educational Trust recruited him and started paying for his secondary education from a school for the blind in Soroti, Eastern Uganda where he has been for six years until 2011, when he completed his A levels.

John's father is a retired soldier who does odd jobs for a living and could not afford paying for his school fees. John studied History, Economics, Christian Religious studies

and Literature in English which he passed well.

"I think I now have my dream of pursuing a university degree and becoming useful to my family in future. Thank you TET and Rotary". said John, when he brought his results to our offices.

LMVC 10 YEARS ANNIVERSARY

It is 10 years since Lords Meade Vocational College opened it's door to the youth of East Africa. With it's mission of providing quality post primary education to it's students, it has provided quality comprehensive education to the youths and empowered them with the skills and abilities to be independent in the society. Among the achievements, are the many old students who have achieved and are now employed in the various vocations of employment. They attribute their success to the quality education offered by LMVC and also the conducive environment which fosters better learning.

The school management is in preparations to hold activities in celebration of the achievements. There will be a lot to showcase from the various departments notably, the vocational department, the science department, the Language department and co-curriculum department.

So far 1651 students have sat for either UNEB 'O' level or 'A' level exams since the College opened. Some students are flying high—Stephen Bwamiki is currently working with the Ugandan Ministry of Finance, visiting many of the Ugandan Embassies around the world to set up a computer accounting package. Henry Kasirye is currently the manager of the Mbale Depot for Nile Breweries. Other old students are studying in UK, USA & Canada.

We look forward to good celebrations this year. Long live LMVC!

2011 UCE, UACE RESULTS

We are glad to communicate that our last years candidates performed well and there were great improvements in both UCE (Uganda Certificate of Education) and UACE (Uganda Advanced Certificate of Education) results. At O-level, out of the 123 candidates, 22 passed in Division One, and at A –level, out of 111 candidates, 24 passed with 4 principle passes and 106 are eligible to join higher institutions of learning. We congratulate all our candidates for their tremendous performance and LMVC emerged the best school in our region. Lords Meade was mentioned in national news paper due to the encouraging results!

Because of this great performance, the school management organized a celebratory party for the staff members and the members of the PTA, for their hard work and efforts in providing quality education to the youths. The teachers expressed their urge to continue working hard.
